Dear Madam/Sir,

the planning application to build 45 houses opposite Abbotsford has been drawn to my attention.

I would like to lend my voice to the opposition to this proposal. The view from Abbotsford is in itself a part of Scotland's cultural heritage since Sir Walter chose the location. I am unconvinced by the intention to plant trees as a screen. Trees grow slowly and are unlikely to provide cover from the upper

storeys for a very long time.

I principally object as the plan fails to value the worth to Scotland of the heritage of Walter Scott and its role in promoting tourism and appreciation of Scotland's literary past.

I cannot be the only one to believe there must be other locations in the vicinity that would serve just as well. Anyone who has been to Giza will recognise how encroachment is a slippery slope once allowed at all. Anyone who thinks the pyramids are in the middle of nowhere is leading a fantasy life. I urge the Council to reconsider.
