I wrote last January (you acknowledged my letter received on 31<sup>st</sup> of 2020) about my concern for the previous MCR consultation on development to the NORTH side of the road running through Eskels.

I now write to reiterate some of my major concerns about the prospect of development BESH 100. Fundamentally my concern about the Ge of the land as my wood, on the south side of the road, which adjoins the fields, owned by [REDACTED] is perilously maintaining a grip on the land which has slipped continuously since I have known and then owned this property, [REDACTED]

A ditch runs along the length between the wood and the fields and is the 'run-off' for the site under consideration (which, incidentally, floods immediately to the North of the road). When flooding occurs, and in the fields to the SOUTH, there is evidence of land slip.

The wood has approximately 100 trees established over a long period and of various types. If it were to disintegrate I suggest 'land slip' would be inevitable if significant development ensues.
