Site Allocation AGALA029, Netherbarns: Proposed Scottish Borders Local Development Plan.

SAVE Britain's Heritage objects strongly to site allocation AGALA029, Netherbarns in the Proposed Scottish Borders Local Development Plan. We consider the allocation of 45 new homes in the setting of the Category A listed Abbotsford House to be inappropriate and we support the grounds for objection set out by the Abbotsford Trust.

Abbotsford is a national shrine of world renown and its rescue and vesting in a preservation trust required a huge and sustained effort by many individuals and heritage bodies over a long period. In <u>listing the house and grounds at Category A</u>, Historic Environment Scotland note that Abbotsford "is one of the most important 19th century buildings in Scotland."

The setting of the house is critical to Abbotsford's historic significance and the long-term benefit of its restoration and opening to the public. We consider this site allocation for up to 45 homes in the immediate setting of the house will cause clear and substantial harm to this nationally protected site by day and by night and must be withdrawn.

Should the council be minded to approve this site allocation, we should request the case be called-in by ministers at a public hearing. We trust this will not be the case, and formally request the Local Planning Authority withdraws this site from its Proposed Development Plan in favour of investigating alternative sites to meet housing demand.

I trust these comments are useful to you and I ask that you keep me informed of further developments regarding public consultation on the Proposed Scottish Borders Local Development Plan.
