What are your comments regarding this Site?:

I object to the proposed development at Eshiels (BESHI001) for the following reasons:

I don't believe this type of commercial development is in keeping with the beautiful landscape that currently surrounds the site. The site is an area of natural beauty and furthermore is a tourist hotspot; this development would spoil the aesthetics of both the lead up to Glentress and to the Peebles boundary. It would make the area less appealing to tourists and I believe that can only have an adverse effect on the areas reputation as an area of outstanding beauty and on local tourism as a whole.
