## IMPACT REPORT FOR QUARTER 4 - JANUARY 2022 to MARCH 2022

## **BERWICKSHIRE**

### TASKING DURING PERIOD

- Quad bike patrols and intelligence gathering in Monynut Forest were carried out by the CAT in January.
- 2. CAT action days on Hare Coursing undertaken.

#### **EVIDENCE OF IMPACT**

- 1. 7 fixed penalty notices in respect of off road motorcycling were issued in one day.
- 3 quad bike patrols carried out and engagement with farmers to encourage reporting of rural crime.

## **CHEVIOT**

#### TASKING DURING PERIOD

- An initiative was carried out in Kelso in January focused on Illegal and inconsiderate parking.
- The CAT are working closely with Midlothian CAT and Northumbria Police regarding quad bike thefts.

#### EVIDENCE OF IMPACT

- Parking patrols, a letter drop to businesses in the town centre and social media messaging were undertaken.
- 2. Night time patrols in February recovered two stashed quad bikes following a theft near Morebattle.

## **EILDON**

#### TASKING DURING PERIOD

- 1. CAT carried out work in respect of antisocial driving in Galashiels alongside Roads Policing Officers and VOSA staff in February.
- Following intelligence received a warrant was executed in Galashiels in March.

#### **EVIDENCE OF IMPACT**

- Vehicles with mechanical issues or defects or which were committing offences were identified. One vehicle was given an instant prohibition order.
- Class A drugs worth £10,400 were seized.

## **TEVIOT**

#### TASKING DURING PERIOD

- 1. Following intelligence received a warrant was executed in Hawick in January.
- 2. Following intelligence received warrants were executed at 2 addresses in Hawick in February.

#### **EVIDENCE OF IMPACT**

- 1. Recovery of over 2 kilograms of herbal cannabis worth up to £30,000 was made.
- 2. Heroin, with a value of up to £18,300 was seized.

## **TWEEDDALE**

#### TASKING DURING PERIOD

- Young people causing damage and issues in Innerleithen in January were addressed by the CAT.
- 2. Fire raising/vandalism at Vale of Leithen football club in February was investigated by the CAT.
- 3. CAT officers attended a housebreaking incident..

#### **EVIDENCE OF IMPACT**

- 1. Several youths were identified and charged for vandalisms in the area.
- 2. 3 youths were identified and charged.
- Following a pursuit a stolen vehicle was recovered and a suspect apprehended.




