NOTICE TO EXEMPT LAND FROM ACCESS RIGHTS

GLENTRESS FOREST & TWEED VALLEY FOREST PARK

9, 10 AND 11 MAY 2025

Notice is hereby given under Section 11(9) of the Land Reform (Scotland) Act 2003 ("the Act") that on 23 August 2024 the Scottish Borders Council made the Scottish Borders Council (Glentress Forest & Tweed Valley Forest Park) (Exemption from Access Rights) Order 2025 ("the Order") under Section 11(1) of the Act.

The effect of the Order is to exempt the following land from the access rights which would otherwise be exercisable in respect of that land by virtue of Part 1 of the Act:

1. That area of land owned by Forestry and Land Scotland as outlined and cross-hatched in red on the map marked "Glentress Forest & Tweed Valley Forest Park" near Peebles annexed hereto.

The purpose for which the Order is made is to accommodate the safe operation of the British National Mountain Bike Cross Country Races event.

The Order will be in effect from 17:00 on Friday 9 May 2025 to 1900 on Sunday 11 May 2025, unless revoked earlier.
