

SCOTTISH BORDERS LOCAL DEVELOPENT PLAN: PROPOSED PLAN ETTRICKBRIDGE

Thank you for your letter of 2 December 2013 from Martin Wanlass and for the opportunity to comment on land use proposals in Ettrickbridge. I have the following comments –

Para 10.33.5 Cemetery, Ettrickbridge

Should there be problems – archaeological or otherwise – in extending the cemetery to the west, then the cemetery at its eastern end could be extended in a southerly direction into the northern sector of the field shown pink on the accompanying plan.

The northern part of that field immediately adjoins the existing cemetery, would be readily accessible from the current access, consists of a level area and has a reasonable depth of top soil.

Para 10.33.6 Small scale village expansion

Mention is made of the fact that small scale expansion of Ettrickbridge village has taken place over the last decade off Woodend Road. Scope exists for further small scale expansion to the west and north west of Woodend West, ie into the field shown pink on the accompanying plan via access shown in brown. This area would be suitable for either private housing or for further affordable housing.

As joint owner of the field in question I would be happy to make myself available to discuss any land use proposals involving that field.
