# WHAT IS THIS NOTICE FOR?

This notice and the information attached to it has been served on you by the person making an application to the Council for planning permission. This is because you are either:

- an owner (or tenant under a lease which has at least 7 years to run); or
- an agricultural tenant;

of the land which they wish to develop. They are legally required to inform you of their proposals.

As an owner, or tenant under a lease which has at least 7 years to run, the grant of planning permission will not affect your rights to retain or dispose of your property unless there is some provision otherwise, for example in a lease or other agreement.

As an agricultural tenant, you may wish to contact your solicitor to find out how a grant of planning permission may affect your security of tenure.

#### WHAT SHOULD I DO NOW?

Firstly, you will want to find out how the proposal may affect you, therefore it is advisable that you see the plans. These will be available at the local Development Control office and a planning officer can be available to discuss them with you, if you wish.

You may have received this notice before the Council actually receives the application or before it has been forwarded to the appropriate office. It is therefore advisable that you telephone before coming in to see the plans.

#### **HOW DO I MAKE REPRESENTATIONS?**

If there is something about the proposal to which you object, then you should make your representations in writing to: The Head of Development Control, Scottish Borders Council, Council Headquarters, Newtown St Boswells, TD6 OSA.

The Council can only consider representations made on valid planning grounds. These are called "material considerations" and some examples are listed below (this list is not exhaustive):

- Contrary to the Local Plan/Structure Plan
- Appearance (design, materials etc)
- Traffic, parking or access problems
- Residential amenity eg noise, overshadowing
- Drainage/infrastructure problems
- Impact on natural or built environment

### WHAT HAPPENS IF I MAKE REPRESENTATIONS?

Any representations made will be placed on the application file where they will be open to public view and may be copied. Your views will be taken into account by the Council when making their decision.

You will be advised in writing of the Council's decision. You do not have a right of appeal against this decision.
