Claim To claim Universal Credit in Scottish Borders you must:

- be a single person and resident in the Scottish Borders
- be a British citizen with a National Insurance number and have lived in UK for more than 2 years
- be aged between 18 years and 60 years and six months and not be in education or training course
- be fit for work, not have applied for a fitness for work (sick) note
- not be pregnant nor have given birth within the last 15 weeks
- not be homeless, in supported or temporary accommodation, nor a homeowner
- not have savings in excess of £6,000 or an income over £338 per month or be self employed
- not be already receiving an income based benefit JSA, ESA, IS, IB, SDA, DLA & PIP (or appealing)
- not be responsible for a child or young person or pay child maintenance via the Child Support Agency
- not be a carer, foster parent or expecting to adopt a child in the next two months
- not have a person acting on your behalf over your claim (corporate appointee)
- have at least one suitable bank account that DWP can pay your money into
- not live in the same household as a member of the regular or reserve forces who is away on duty

IN THE SCOTTISH BORDERS

From 27 April 2015 Universal Credit is available for some new claimants. A full list of people who can apply is on page 4. It is a new benefit introduced by Department for Work and Pensions for people who are on a low income or out of work and replaces existing benefits Jobseeker's Allowance, Employment Support Allowance, Income Support, Tax Credits and Housing Benefit.

This new benefit will be paid into your bank account each month and it will be your responsibility to make sure that you pay your bills, including your rent.

You must apply online at www.gov.uk/ universalcredit. It is important that you claim as soon as you can because your benefit will be calculated from the day that you first apply. In exceptional circumstances claims can be made by telephone.


You will need the following information when you apply:



Once you have applied you will receive a telephone call to invite you to a Work Focused Interview at your local Jobcentre. You will be asked to bring evidence of the above information to that interview.

how to get online

If you do not have access to the internet, public access computers are available at your local Jobcentre Plus or your local library or contact centre. It is best to book a place to avoid disappointment. If you need assistance using a computer staff will be able to advise you.

personal budgeting advice

If you are concerned about budgeting your income you should mention this during your Work Focused Interview. Your work coach can arrange for you to receive advice. You may also approach the Citizens Advice Bureau or your Housing Association for help and advice. Contact details are overleaf.
