3. <b>De</b>	escription:	Part 2 (Community Planning) of the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015 requires each Community Planning Partnership (CPP) in Scotland to prepare and publish a local outcomes improvement plan (LOIP) which sets out the local outcomes which the CPP will prioritise for improvement.  The LOIP should detail how public bodies work together and with the local community to plan for, resource and provide services which improve local outcomes in the local authority area, all with a view to reducing inequalities.  The participation of and with communities lies at the heart of community planning and applies in the development, design and delivery of the LOIP as well as in the review, revision and reporting.  The LOIP is to be published by 1 <sup>st</sup> October 2017, and progress reported annually.  The Act also expands the number of public sector bodies that are subject to community planning duties from the statutory partners - local authority, Health Board, Scottish Enterprise, Police Scotland, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and the Regional Transport Partnership.
