






SCOTTISH BORDERS TOWN MATRIX AND TOWN CENTRE INDEX HOW ARE OUR TOWNS DOING?



A **Scottish Borders' Town Matrix** has been constructed, pulling together a range of measures that are relevant to assessing the general "health" of our towns. The towns included in this matrix have a population of 2000 or more.

From the Matrix, a **Town Centre Index (TCI)** has then been created and provides a way to better understand the economic and social robustness / potential need of our town centres in the Scottish Borders, relative to one another. Within the index, a ranking of "1" indicates greatest potential need and "10" least potential need.

Below, a short description of each measure used within the Town Matrix has been provided.

<p>JOBSEEKER ALLOWANCE (JULY 2016) Jobseeker Allowance is an indicator of the health of the labour market.</p> <p>Source: DWP</p>	<p>TOWN CENTRE FOOTFALL The number of people using our town centres, known as the "footfall" is an indicator of town centre vibrancy.</p>  <p>Source: SBC</p>	<p>RETAIL UNITS AND VACANCY The number of retail units available and vacancy rates are indicators of town centre dynamics, e.g. businesses coming and going.</p>  <p>Source: SBC</p>
<p>HOUSING TENURE Insight into the type of housing within a town e.g. rented, owned etc.</p>  <p>Source: USP</p>	<p>SOCIAL GRADE (% HOUSEHOLDS AGED 16-64) Insight into social and economic circumstances of the people within a town, which will affect their spending ability and use of key services.</p> <p>Source: USP</p>	<p>QUALIFICATIONS (% ALL PEOPLE AGED 16 AND OVER) Insight into the qualifications of adults within the town and how well they might meet the needs of employers and businesses.</p> <p>Source: USP</p>
