The NRS projects that the population of Berwickshire will decrease by 1% between 2015 and 2026.

There is variation by age group:

-1% all ages (SB = 1%; SCOT = 4%)

**-4%** aged 0-15 (SB = 0%; SCOT = +6%)

**-12%** aged 16-64 (SB = -8%; SCOT = -1%)

+24% aged 65+ (SB = +25%; SCOT = +22%)



#### **HEALTH**

Similar rate of hospitalisations for coronary heart disease compared to the Scottish Borders and Scotland.

More early deaths from coronary heart disease compared to the Scottish Borders but similar to Scotland.

#### Slightly more emergency admissions

compared to the Scottish Borders; but more compared to Scotland.

**Lower** rate of multiple emergency hospitalisations for patients (65+) compared to the Scottish Borders but higher than Scotland.

7.9% feel lonely or isolated

29.9% adults exercise daily (SB = 29.0%)
