

Nomination Form

The Scottish Borders Year of Young People/Inspire Awards acknowledge the achievements and successes of young people in the Scottish Borders. Do you know any young people in your community who have inspired others and deserve to be recognised?

Nominees must reside in the Scottish Borders, be between the ages of 8 and 25 inclusive, with the exception of the Children & Young People's Champion Award (see below), and be available on the evening of <u>Friday 16th November 2018</u> to celebrate the achievements of young people in the Scottish Borders.

Award Categories

As 2018 is nationally recognised as the Year of Young People we have decided to change up the categories this year to reflect the aims and themes of the Year.

The YOYP 2018 aims to inspire Scotland through its young people, celebrating their achievements, valuing their contribution to communities and creating new opportunities for them to shine locally, nationally and globally.

Themes:

- **Culture:** A young person of group who have displayed a creative talent or have made a meaningful contribution to Scottish culture and arts.
- Education: A young person or group who have made a meaningful contribution to decision making within education and learning.
- Enterprise and regeneration: A young person or group who have contributed innovative ideas and entrepreneurial skills to the local economy or have been working towards making Scotland a greener and more pleasant place to live.
- Equality and discrimination: A young person or group who have taken the lead in challenging all forms of prejudice and discrimination.
- **Health and wellbeing:** A young person or group who have been working towards making sure young people have the chance to lead healthy, active lives and understand the importance of mental health and resilience.
- **Participation**: A young person or group who have made a meaningful contribution to influencing decision making which affects young people's lives locally or nationally.

Young Leader Award: A young person who deserves recognition for their leadership skills.

Inspirational Young Person: A young person or group who you feel has gone above and beyond what is expected of them and who you feel are an inspiration to other young people.

Children & Young People's Champion: This Award is for any Adult (paid staff, volunteer or community member) who young people feel has made a significant positive impact upon their lives and who they feel should gain recognition for their ability to champion children & young people in the Scottish Borders.

Reason for Nomination

As part of the Awards ceremony we will be showing the nomination videos of the shortlisted nominees. For this reason we would like all nominations to be submitted as a video answering the questions below and lasting no longer than 1 minute 30 seconds.

Please give a brief outline of the nominee's role and what they have done to qualify for this award. When deciding on award winners we consider the following information:

Why you feel this person or group is inspirational. What makes them stand out from other young people i.e. what makes their contribution, commitment or achievements exceptional? What obstacles have they overcome and/or what challenges they have faced including personal challenges. Please list any personal benefits and/or benefits to others (personal achievement is just as inspirational as community benefit. Will there be a future impact? What motivated them to be inspirational?

You may include quotes from people who support your nomination of this young person/group.

- I would like to nominate this Individual or Group because:
- Please tell us exactly what this individual/group has achieved and what challenges, if any, they have faced?
- Why do you feel this individual/group is inspirational? (Have they gone above and beyond or done something out of the ordinary?)
- In what ways has this individual/group benefitted from the work they have done?
- What impact has this individual/group made on the people around them?
- How is this going to impact people in the future?

Filming support

Top tips for filming your nomination video:

- State your name at the start of the video
- Speak clearly and slowly
- If filming inside, stand against a plain background
- Prepare what you want to say before-hand, pin your notes up in front of you if you need to read them while filming so that you are looking at the camera
- Try to film in natural daylight with the sun to the front or to the side of you, not behind.
- You can use a camera, phone or a tablet to film the clip.
- Remove bracelets or bangles before filming this is to avoid unwanted sounds should you move your hands when talking.
- Try to film in a quiet location
- When saving your video please save it under the same name as you gave at the start
