Currently, there are three schools in Jedburgh; Howdenburn Primary School, Parkside Primary School and Jedburgh Grammar School and a partnership provider for additional Early Learning and Childcare. Ancrum Primary is a rural feeder primary school where children attend from primary 1 - 4 then transfer to Parkside Primary School for primary 5 - 7. During the Borders School Estates consultation process it became evident that there was a strong demand within the Community for changes to the education provision in Jedburgh, in particular there were concerns raised to ensure that the estate was brought to a standard to optimise the learning potential and community inclusion within Jedburgh.
