### How to access Welfare Trust funds

The Scottish Borders Welfare Trust awards grants of up to a maximum of **£1,000** to **non-constituted groups/individuals** and up to a maximum of **£2,500** to **fully constituted groups**. **Please contact the Communities and Partnerships Team to discuss what amounts are available.**

To be successful a group/individual **must**:

- Demonstrate need **or**
- Carry out positive work in the community and be of charitable nature and 'Not for Profit' status **or**
- Be community or socially focused **and**
- Deliver the activity/project within the specified locality/area

Only one funding application can be made to the Community Welfare Trust by any single group in any one financial year.

The funding requested should be the minimum required to enable the project to go ahead.

Please note: if you are successful – it can take up to one month for us to process your payment.

If your project involves construction or refurbishment of a building you need to have heritable ownership of the land or building, or hold a lease which cannot be brought to an end by the landlord for at least 5 years.

You should also have contacted Scottish Borders Council Development Control Officers in advance to discuss projects where they involve physical works.

If required by your project - planning permission needs to be in place before applying for funding.
