Core Path Planning Update

Core Paths are still being upgraded and signposted as required. NM advised forum of existing reviews which are linked to the maintenance and promotion of Core Paths. The bridges and publications audit. These Audits will be completed early 2013.

8. A.O.B

- BM asked if the Forum had any information on the development of a riding route near Oxton. **NM to request information from Oxton CC.**
- BM advised of a Land Reform review of locked gates which BHS are undertaking with the National Access Forum (View paper: http://www.snh.gov.uk/docs/A563776.pdf)
- NM advised that the commitment of member organisations has been limited over the last 2 years. This is could be due to a number of re-structuring and financial issues, however most likely due to a lack of physical projects and that the Core Paths Plan has largely been implemented without many issues. NM advised that the Council wishes to review the operations of the Forum through a survey and requests that all members complete the survey (as attached) and pass it onto other interested parties. Surveys are requested to be returned by January 29th 2013.
- Also noted that the Interim Agreement (as attached) has not been fully agreed by all
 parties. NM advised that all organisations should instruct its adoption by emailing or

- discussing further with N. Mackay. Action ALL
- NM advised of existing access issue located within Broughton (papers circulated).
 The Forum recommended that the Council advises the landowner of their liability
 and that of the Core Path status. The Forum agreed that horses could be seen as
 being dangerous depending on the activity to the public therefore liability of any
 injury would fall upon the landowner. E Niven to issue letter.
- A request from Melrose Paths Group to seek resolution to the poor surface of route approaching Eildon Hills. NM advised the Council has sought costs from a contractor to install drainage. NM to clarify implementation.

- BC updated the Forum on the Forestry Commission's policy on car park charges. The
 policy aims to charge a nominal daily car parking fee where there are additional
 facilities installed such as toilets, etc to assist the costs of these facilities. 15% of all
 Forestry Commission car parks issue a charge.
- The Forum discussed the legalities surrounding events within the outdoors, in particular the need to inform landowners. There are a guidelines available from Scottish Natural Heritage which clearly outline it is 'essential' to contact landowners and instances when landowner's 'permissions' are required.
